1. Deceive (verb) & Deception (noun)

- *Definition:*
 - i. To cause someone to believe something that is not true
 - ii. The act of deceiving someone
- *Sentence:* “Let’s not have any **deception** here!” Father said angrily. “How many of the boys at the Battle School actually end up in command of ships!” (15)

2. Sullen (adjective)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Bad tempered and gloomy
 - ii. Sad and depressed
- *Sentence:* “There were other boys near him, tired-looking boys, **sullen**, the ones least valued. They had nothing of welcome to say to Ender.” (56)

3. Incredulous (adjective)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Unwilling or unable to believe something
 - ii. Being surprised, in an unbelieving way
- *Sentence:* “And he passed?” Mother was **incredulous**. “Putting the Stilson boy in the hospital? What would you have done if Andrew had killed him, given him a medal?” (14)

4. Disorientation (noun)

- *Definition:*
 - i. The feeling of not knowing or understanding the direction you are facing or exactly where you are
 - ii. The feeling of being confused, mostly having to do with your surroundings
- *Sentence:* “They say that weightlessness can cause **disorientation**, especially in children, whose sense of direction isn’t yet secure” (16)

5. Apex (Noun)

- *Definition:*
 - i. The top or highest part of something
- *Sentence:* “He could sit on the see-saw until he rose to the **apex**; then he fell” (52)

6. Chasm (noun)

- *Definition:*
 - i. A serious difference of opinion or feeling
 - ii. A gigantic gap, division, separation, or difference
- *Sentence:* “His fault or not, he’s poisoning that group. They’re supposed to bond, and right where he stands there’s a **chasm** a mile wide” (40)

7. Ambiguous (adjective)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Capable of being understood or explained more than one way
 - ii. Uncertain in meaning
- *Sentence:* “They both renounced their religions but in fact their feelings are still **ambiguous**” (16)

8. Hegemony (noun)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Leadership and dominance, especially by one country or social group
- *Sentence:* “I reserve the right to communicate with the **Hegemony** and the Strategoi at any time. But for now – do what you want” (71)

9. Inadequate (adjective)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Not acceptable in quality or quantity
- *Sentence:* “Then he settled down to the serious business of designing a security system for his own desk, since the safeguards built into the system were obviously **inadequate**.” (38)

10. Magnanimous (adjective)

- *Definition:*
 - i. Very generous and forgiving, especially towards a rival, or someone less powerful than yourself
- *Sentence:* “Still, he would only know that Ender had beaten him, and then rubbed his nose in it by being **magnanimous**” (63)
